Come along and spend a pleasurable Sunday afternoon at the Andy Warhol Museum, one of the four Carnegie Museums of Pittsburgh. We will take a one-hour general tour of the Museum with a focused discussion on specific works and/or themes customized to our group's interest. Tours are led by Artist/Educators - diverse working artists who bring their own practice, innovative ideas and experience to the interpretation of Warhol's art.

Andy Warhol was born Andrew Warhola on August 6, 1928, in a two-room row house apartment at 73 Orr Street in Pittsburgh. His parents, Carpatho-Rusyn immigrants Andrej and Julia Warhola, had three sons. Andy was their youngest. In 1942, Andy entered Schenley High School. Recognizing his son's talent, Andrej had saved money to pay for his son's college education. Warhol attended Carnegie Institute of Technology (now Carnegie Mellon University) from 1945 to 1949. He earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Pictorial Design with the goal of becoming a commercial illustrator. Andy Warhol died in 1987 and is buried in St. John the Baptist Cemetery located at 1066 Connor Rd, Pittsburgh, PA 15102.
